Switzerland supports municipalities to improve energy management and energy efficiency and helps Serbia in reaching its energy saving target.

What is the goal?

The goal is to support more sustainable energy management at the municipal level through the introduction of the European Energy Award (EEA), to improve the energy efficiency of public buildings through refurbishment measures and to strengthen the foundation for long-term engagements through tailored capacity building.

Where do we work?

We work at the local level, in Krusevac, Paracin, Uzice and Vrbas.

Who do we cooperate with?


Ministry of Mining and Energy, Standing Conference of Towns and Municipalities and selected cities and municipalities.

What will be achieved?

European Energy Award (EEA) will be introduced in Serbia and an initial review of selected cities and municipalities carried out. The cities and municipalities will be assisted in implementing selected activities that will bring them closer to the European Energy Award certification and at the same time improve their energy management and their compliance with national legislation regarding local energy management.

20 public buildings will be rehabilitated in terms of energy efficiency. Capacity building activities will be implemented for the staff in city and municipality administrations, and in public buildings.
